It's late in the afternoon before school. I have been waiting a long time to start this letter, because I have been waiting to see what I could report. The news, as of this hour, isn't what I hoped.

On Friday, Marisol officially resigned to take a teaching position closer to her home. Even when Marisol's departure was not certain, we were interviewing, just in case. We're not done seeking solutions. It's possible that the teacher who has been present in our school for several days will be approved to start work officially. It's also possible that we will move onto other options.

I am disappointed not to be writing a formal introduction now. I am grateful to have Eunice, Cecilia, Jessica, and Winnie teaming up for our four-fives.
