Dear Families,

A budget is a list of priorities expressed in dollars. How you spend says what you value.

Usually, by the end of May, schools can start to plan with their budget for the next school year. It is mid-June, and we still have not seen next year's budget. The economy is weak, so the city has to cut nine *billion* dollars. The question is what to cut. The question is how our city will express our priorities.

I was among [hundreds of public school employees who signed this letter](#). Of course I am fighting for a bigger budget for CPE1 students. At first the mayor proposed to increase the police department budget while slashing education and mental health. I think communities will be safer if we invest more in counselors than in updating NYPD riot gear.

The mayor now has signaled that the city may reduce the police budget. To get the most for school children, New Yorkers have to keep being vocal. The [NYC Coalition for Educational Justice](#) has declared today a day of action. It is not too late [to sign up to be involved](#), and it is definitely not too late to express your beliefs on social media.

I have been waiting to write to you about our budget until I could share just how big the cuts will be. I'm not in such a hurry to write that budget letter. I can wait a little longer, and make my voice a little louder, if communities get more of what they deserve.
